BY THE NUMBERS


- In multiple years, the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u> found construction and extraction was the no. 1 occupational group with male suicides (15% in 2012, 16% in 2015)
- In the general population, suicide occurs in 27 out of every 100,000 people. In construction, the number is closer to 53 suicides per 100,000 workers.
- In the U.S., there are approximately 123 suicides per day which breaks down to one death every 12 minutes. (SafeBuild Alliance)

WHY IT MATTERS

September is Suicide Awareness Month, and Sept. 4-8 is Construction Suicide Prevention Week, so we want to do everything in our power to help save our fellow teammates. Throughout, we'll be sharing tools and resources to stamp out the stigma of asking for help, and possibly help save some lives in the meantime.
