With approximately 7.5 million people employed in construction in the U.S. and far more worldwide, people need access to the tools that could save a life and reverse the trend that has placed construction as an industry with one of the highest rates of death by suicide.

About us

- In 2020, a mission-driven group of volunteers from across the construction industry came together with one goal: to save lives. They collaborated to launch the inaugural Construction Suicide Prevention
 Week a week dedicated to raising awareness about the high number of suicides in the industry, and to provide <u>resources</u> to help prevent those deaths.
- Every year, during September National Suicide Prevention Month the construction industry dedicates a week to raising awareness about the unique challenges workers face in construction, how it can lead to suicide, and what we can do to prevent it. Together, we can save lives.



TOOLBOX TALK CONSTRUCTION AND SUICIDE

You know the dangers that come from working on a job site, we talk about them often during Toolbox Talks, but what about those that lurk when you're off the job?

Suicide is one of our industry's "best kept secrets," and it's killing us. Literally.

BY THE NUMBERS

 In multiple years, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention found construction and extraction was the no. I occupational group with male suicides (I5% in 2012, I6% in 2015)

 In the general population, suicide occurs in 27 out of every 100,000 people. In construction, the number is closer to 53 suicides per 100,000 workers.

- In the U.S., a construction worker dies by suicide once every 12 minutes. Another way to look at it: 123 of us die from suicide each day.

WHY IT MATTERS

September is Suicide Awareness Month, and Sept. 5-9 is Construction Suicide Prevention Week, so we want to do everything in our power to help save our fellow teammates. Throughout, we'll be sharing tools and resources to stamp out the stigma of asking for help, and possibly help save some lives in the meantime.

RESOURCES FOR CONSTRUCTION EMPLOYERS

The construction industry has the second highest rate of suicide in the United States at 53.3 per 100,000 workers according to the Center for Disease Control (CDC). In the U.S. there are approximately 123 suicides per day that breaks down to one death every 12 minutes. (SafeBuild Alliance)

It will take all of us to prevent suicide. Luckily, there are many resources to help employers effectively support mental wellness among their workers or use for content to hold a stand-down or other event with your employees.
